As we approach Fall 2020, HRCMOAA Legislative Affairs remains haze gray and underway. This update presents four sections. First, a snapshot of how COVID 19 has affected the United States Congress. Second, spotlight on the National Defense Authorization Act 2021. Third, brief summary of an otherwise productive Zoom Meeting Session with Senator Mark Warner (D VA) during Summer Storming 2020. Finally, a summary of the MOAA Guidance on Partisan Political Activities.

COVID 19

To varying degrees the COVID 19 Pandemic has affected both our professional and personal lives, with the 116th Congress being no exception. After months of delay, the Senate returned in May, with the House side continuing to abstain. As of this writing, both chambers are in session. This noted, a number of lawmakers have been infected with COVID 19, with dozens more on congressional staffs testing positive.

The Coronavirus Crisis Special Series article from National Public Radio entitled, "How The Coronavirus Has Affected Individual Members Of Congress," reports ten Senators and 54 Representatives testing or presumed positive for COVID 19. One member of our Virginia delegation was among those positive: Representative Don Beyer (VA 8th).

President's Message



Fellow Officers and Spouses,



Keeping our chapter members safe as the COVID 19 pandemic continues, remains our top priority. Our normal luncheon venue has not reopened for events with outside groups so we are not able to resume our calendar of monthly meetings/luncheons. This past year, several of your HRCMOAA board members met with Ms. Andrea Rand, the director of the MOAA Scholarship program to request some changes to how scholarships in our chapter name were being awarded. As a result of our suggestions and input, the MOAA Scholarship Fund Board has agreed to make several important changes. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, the MOAA Scholarship Fund Board will give preference in awarding scholarships and grants to children with HRCMOAA chapter member parents. While not guaranteed to go to the child of a chapter member, those children applying for MOAA scholarships with a parent who is a chapter member will receive favorable consideration and the review board will give preference in awarding scholarships to those children. Regardless of whether the student's parent is a chapter member or not, students selected for MOAA scholarships in the chapter name will always be from the area represented by our Hampton Roads Chapter. Below is the status of our chapter scholarship fund both for this year and overall for the 5-year goal.

NDAA 2021

The purpose of NDAA 2021 is, “To authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2021 for military activities of the Department of Defense, for military construction, and for defense activities of the Department of Energy, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes.” To the NDAA 2021 vote in the Congress, the Senate passed S.4049 by a vote of 86-14, with the House passing S.4049 by a vote of 295-125. Both packages permit \$740.5 billion in defense spending. HASC Chairman Rep. Adam Smith (D-Wash.). HASC Chairman Rep. Adam Smith (D-Wash) said, “The bill we passed ... supports our troops, reflects our values, and provides for a strong national defense.”

Keep in mind that the federal budget process is of two stages: appropriations and authorizations. NDAA 2021 is an authorization bill, directing how federal funds are utilized. Aforementioned noted, the NDAA 2021 is reported unlikely to advance until after the Presidential Election in November. Congress is aiming to forward a final NDAA 2021 package to the White House by year end, stay tuned for further update.

Summer Storming 2020

To Summer Storming 2020, a Virginia Council of Chapters Zoom Session with U.S. Senator Mark Warner (D-VA) was held on 19 August 2020. The meeting included advocacy for the top MOAA Legislative Priorities 2020, as follows:

- Halt to proposed military medical capacity reductions and restructure.
- Major Richard Star Act, Concurrent Receipt, which Senator Warner now supports.

MOAA Non Partisan Policy

With MOAA exempt from federal taxation under Sec. 501(c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Code, MOAA and affiliates must avoid engaging in partisan political activities. IRS rules dictate that MOAA is prohibited from participating, either indirectly or directly, in political campaigning. In turn, MOAA is prohibited from advocating for any political party, be it orally or in writing.

MOAA leaders have the responsibility to separate their personal political views from statements attributed to MOAA or its affiliates. Partisan political support of one party or candidate by a MOAA leader undermines MOAA’s ability to gain bipartisan consensus on key issues intrinsic to achievement of legislative objectives. Commingling of personal views with MOAA is not only a violation of a MOAA leader’s fiduciary duty to MOAA, but a leadership and ethical failure.

Consequences for violation of the MOAA Non Partisan policy can be strict, to include loss of tax exempt status and imposition of certain excise taxes.



NAVY PLATE VIRGINIA



ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Cost and Revenue Share: The Navy plate is a revenue share with **Navy and Marine Corps Relief Society**. NMCRS will receive \$15 annually for every plate sold (after 1,000 initial sales), tax deductible as a charitable contribution.

1. Annual plate fee is \$25 for standard series, will start at 1001XX (series letters TBD)
2. Annual plate fee is \$35 for personalized plates and must comply with DMV content rules.
3. Motorcycles, veteran-owned business vehicles, disabled plates are included.
4. For Virginia, plate purchase is separate from registration renewal (decals). New plates may be purchased at any time for a registered vehicle. You may preorder this plate immediately, please do not wait for registration renewal to be due.

Plate development: The entire process takes up to nine months. Once the Governor signs the bill and DMV receives the 450 preorder applications and payment, the plate development process will begin. As a courtesy, the vehicle registration will be renewed if it is within two months of expiration and DMV will bill for payment. Also, applicants with a multi-year vehicle registration will receive a bill for the additional year(s). The new license plates, vehicles registration, and decals will be mailed to all preorder applicants prior to the new plate's statewide availability.

Military ID Card Notification Program

This voluntary program is designed to help Chapter members and their dependent's to renew their ID cards in a timely fashion. Once you and your dependents are enrolled, you will be notified of your impending ID card expiration date in sufficient time for renewal prior to the expiration date.

To enroll by mail: make copies of the form below for each dependent and fill out the required information. Mail to Military ID Card Notification Program, HRCMOAA, PO Box 4612, Virginia Beach, VA 23454-0612.

To enroll by email: visit our website, www.hrcmoaa.org and click on About Our Chapter and the ID Card Notification Program link and follow the instructions.

Note: Over age 75 members, who are eligible uniform family members and survivors of deceased personnel are now eligible for Permanent Identification Cards. Apply within 90 days of expiration of current ID card.

Note on your check that it is for the Hampton Roads Chapter ROTC Scholarship Fund. MOAA will continue to send receipts.

A **third** way is to contribute directly from bequests, wills, trusts, or IRA's. The fund tax identification number is 54-1659039. By contributing from the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) of a qualified IRA, the taxable IRA income can be reduced by the amount of the contribution. The contribution check must be marked as a charitable contribution. With the change in the tax laws last year, some of our members have found this method to be beneficial. For additional detail, it would be best to contact your IRA fund manager for specifics relating to your IRA.

Surviving Spouse Corner: Preparing for the Unpredictable

Many women — and men — are blindsided by the death of a spouse, because couples rarely talk about the inevitable.

When you are at your most vulnerable, you must make choices that will have an enduring impact. Should the body be cremated or preserved? What type of service and where will it be held? Will he or she be buried in a hometown family plot or in a national cemetery many miles away?

To be better prepared for these difficult decisions, take time to have that important conversation with your spouse and your children about death and what happens after death. This conversation is a gift of love that each member of a marriage or family makes to the other.

Resources are available on [MOAA.org](#) and other websites that will help you have those conversations and make planning for the unknown perhaps a little easier. Find out who your local veteran service officer is, get to know them before you really need them, and then make sure they are the first on your list to contact.

Ask your chapter to schedule at least one meeting each year where these issues are discussed. MOAA, [the Surviving Spouse Advisory Council](#), and your surviving spouse liaison can provide members with a wealth of information.

Steps to take:

- Encourage members and spouses to talk to each other about end-of-life issues and ways to prepare.
- Prepare and organize important documents (such as DD Form 214, wills, living will, durable power of attorney, insurance policies, birth/marriage certificates, passwords, insurance policies, bank account and investment information).
- Make sure utilities are in both names.
- Open a credit card account in *your name*.
- Establish eligibility for burial in a VA National Cemetery.
- Make a list of helpful resources, including [MOAA](#), [the VA](#), [AARP.org](#), [Military OneSource](#), [MOAA Minnesota Chapter “The Day After Calls.”](#) MOAA’s [Surviving Spouse Virtual Chapter](#), and [MOAA’s Surviving Spouses and Friends Facebook group](#).

As spouse and surviving spouse, it is important you think about yourself and *your survivors and the things they will need to know. 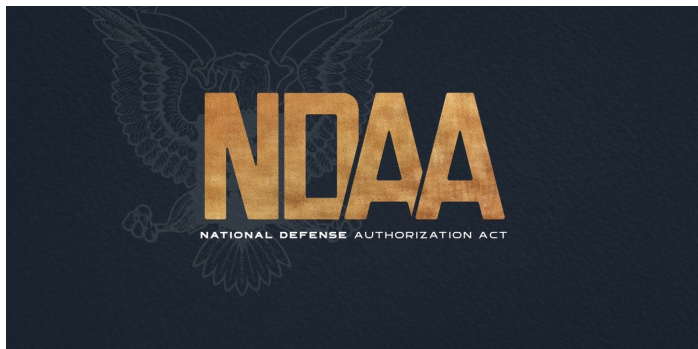
