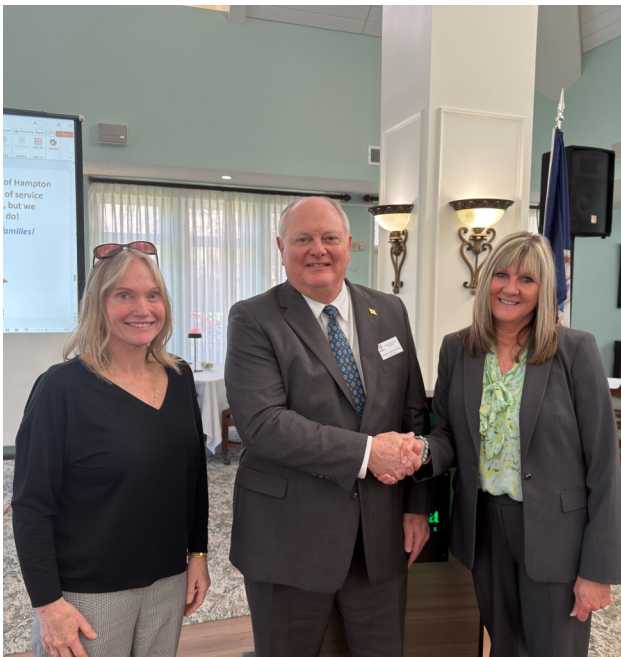

## Strengthening Emotional Well-Being

The death of a military spouse reshapes emotional well-being in ways that reach far beyond grief itself. It is a loss that touches identity, daily rhythm, and the quiet sense of safety that comes from sharing life with someone who understood both the burdens and the pride of service.

For many, the brain responds to this kind of profound disruption with a mix of numbness, hypervigilance, and deep fatigue — natural reactions to a heart trying to make sense of a world suddenly changed. Yet within that upheaval, emotional well-being becomes not just a hope but a necessity: a steadying force that helps the mind process sorrow, rebuild resilience, and slowly rediscover moments of connection, purpose, and peace. This journey is neither quick nor linear, but it reflects the same courage and endurance that military families have always carried.

Emotional well-being and brain health are deeply interconnected, shaping how we think, cope, and experience daily life. Strong emotional balance supports healthier brain function, while a well-nourished brain strengthens our ability to manage stress, build relationships, and maintain resilience.

Research shows that chronic stress can harm key brain regions involved in emotional control, memory, and decision-making, including the prefrontal cortex, amygdala, and hippocampus. When these areas are disrupted, people might experience anxiety, irritability, or difficulty concentrating.

Positive emotional states — such as purpose, connection, and calm — help regulate stress hormones and support cognitive performance. People who report higher emotional stability and life satisfaction tend to support stronger memory and decision-making abilities as they age.

Conversely, chronic stress elevates cortisol, which can shrink the hippocampus and overactivate the amygdala, making emotional regulation more difficult and increasing vulnerability to depression or anxiety.

The brain communicates constantly with the body through neural pathways and chemical messengers. Neurotransmitters like serotonin, dopamine, and norepinephrine influence mood, motivation, and focus. When these systems are imbalanced, emotional well-being can suffer.

Physical factors such as sleep, inflammation, and fatigue also affect how the brain processes emotions, reinforcing the need for whole-body care.



## Military ID Card Notification Program

This voluntary program is designed to help Chapter members and their dependent's to renew their ID cards in a timely fashion. Once you and your dependents are enrolled, you will be notified of your impending ID card expiration date in sufficient time for renewal prior to the expiration date.

The Hampton Roads Chapter has been very successful and fortunate in its previous two five-year scholarship fund campaigns thanks to the generosity of the chapter members and their commitment to helping young men and women attend college through scholarships and grants from MOAA. As a result of the success in the previous

two campaigns, the board decided to commission another five-year scholarship fund campaign to run from 2023 through 2027 with an annual goal in each year of \$5,000.00 and an overall five-year goal of \$25,000.00.

There are several ways you can donate to the HRCMOAA scholarship fund. All donations are tax deductible as the MOAA Scholarship Fund is a qualified IRS 501(c)(3) entity.

The first way is for members to submit their donations online by using the following website URL: <https://charities.moaa.org>

The second way is to submit a check, made out to the MOAA Scholarship Fund and mail it to:

**Important: Note on your check that it is for the Hampton Roads Chapter Scholarship Fund. MOAA will continue to send receipts to all contributors.**

A third way is to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution. The fund tax identification number is 54-1659039. By contributing from the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) of a qualified IRA, the taxable IRA income can be reduced by the amount of the contribution. The contribution check must be marked as a charitable contribution. With the recent changes in the tax laws, some of our members have found this method to be beneficial. You can make qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) of varying amounts to more than one charitable organization each year. IRA owners age 70 ½ or older can give up to \$100,000 a year directly from their IRA to qualified charities. But you can split that amount among multiple charities. Say you want to give a total of \$50,000 through the QCD move. You could give five charities \$10,000 each, for instance, or two charities \$25,000 each. Just tell your custodian which charities you want to support and how much to transfer directly from your IRA.

Not only will the charity benefit from the QCDs, but you will too. The QCD amount is excluded from your taxable income and can also count toward your annual required minimum distribution. It's a win-win-win. For additional details, it would be best to contact your IRA fund manager, personal financial planner or tax accountant for specifics.

## Old Dominion Honor Flight Mission #10



Old Dominion Honor Flight continued its mission of transporting America's veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit the memorials dedicated to honoring those who have served and sacrificed for our country. The Network serves over 22,000 veterans each year. This year's departure ceremony commenced at 5am and took place Saturday April 18, 2026 at the American Legion Post No. 25 Newport News, Virginia. Several ODU Army/Navy ROTC and Princess Ann/Lanstown high school JNROTC units participated. Students had the opportunity to have a sit down breakfast with veterans and set up a corridor of honor as veterans loaded into waiting buses for their collective trip to D.C.

Since its formation in 2005, the Honor Flight Network has taken more than 240,000 veterans to Washington D.C. Today, the Honor Flight Network is currently composed of over 125 hubs throughout the country dedicated to carrying out the Honor Flight mission and comrades lost and sharing their stories and experiences with other veterans. All honored veterans travel at no cost to the veteran. While originally focused on honoring our nation's World War II veterans, the Honor Flight Network now also honors those who served in the Korean War, Vietnam War, intermediary operations, and in special cases of terminal illness or injury, veterans from more recent service eras.

Hampton Roads Regional Hub is the Old Dominion Honor Flight. For nearly 15 years, our local Hampton Roads Chapter Military Officers Association

of America has supported these departure ceremonies. Missions include stops at the WWII Memorial, the Korean Memorial, the Vietnam Memorial, the Arlington National Cemetery, The Marine Corps Museum at Quantico and some other area memorials, as time permits. Three meals are also provided during the mission. As mentioned there is no cost for the veterans. Guardians pay their own cost approximately \$125. Due to our proximity to Washington and our ability to add buses as needed, we have no waiting list. Honor Flight can take veterans in wheelchairs.

Select "Apply Now" and you'll find Veteran Online/Paper Application and Guardian Online/Paper application. This is an amazing experience for both veterans and guardians alike. Those that have been participants have always expressed sincere appreciation for the opportunity.

## Lieutenant Commander Walter Wesolowski, United States Navy (Ret).

Walter was born and raised on a farm in Vernon Township, New Jersey, where he developed the strong work ethic and sense of duty that would define his life. In 1955, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, completing boot camp at Parris Island, South Carolina, and Advanced Infantry Training at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.

His career in the United States Navy began when he enrolled in the Naval Flight Training program in Pensacola, Florida.
